- I. Call to Order
President Westerhout called the meeting to order at 5:31 p.m.
- II. Roll Call

- III. Introduction of Public
No public was present.
- IV. Public Comment
There were no public comments.
- V. President's Report
President Westerhout reported that there is continued interest in the library and the library expansion in relationship to the upcoming election in April. He went on to say that there is some hope that there are a few Council members that will help propel the idea of an expansion forward.
- VI. Director's Report
Director Hamilton reported that Polaris (new catalog/checkout system) training has begun, and staff is very excited about it. Staff are being trained in layers, with all staff training beginning late February or early March. Director Hamilton shared that the Per Capita Grant application was filed.
Director Hamilton stated that Children's staff reached out to the folks at Bobzbay Bookstore about partnering for a Drag Queen Storytime, and they were not interested in doing so at this time. There was some discussion about the public's reaction, throughout the country, to this sort of story time.

Director Hamilton distributed information on two Trustee Forums that the Illinois Library Association is offering. Each has a different agenda, and one is located in Springfield, the other is in Oak Brook.

Tim Gleason, City Manager, has asked City Departments to submit 2018 accomplishments. She shared a few that she will be including, such as, the resolution for expansion here, Bingo for Books Grant with the Illinois Prairie Foundation, Children's Discovery Museum passes, first full year of working with NPL and Unit 5 to offer student cards, A/V area project, and Summer Reads program.

Director Hamilton apologized to Catrina Parker, for not being recognized for being appointed to the Library Board by the Mayor at the City Council meeting last night.

VII. Fiscal Report Presentation

Kathy Jeakins, Business Manager, reported that the budget should be at 67% through the end of December. She entertained questions.
